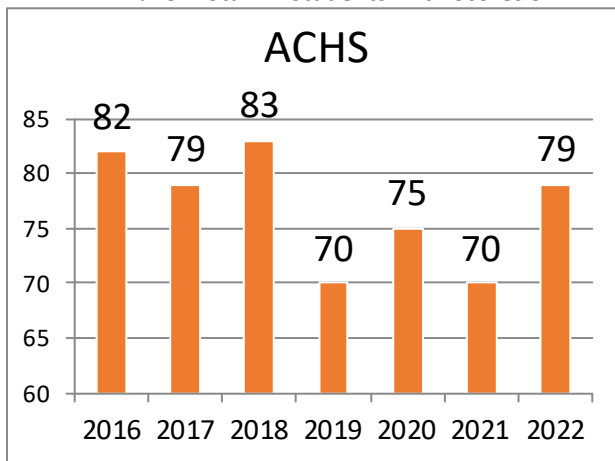

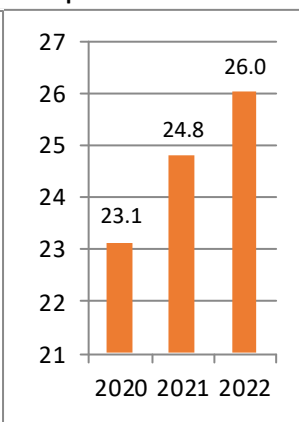
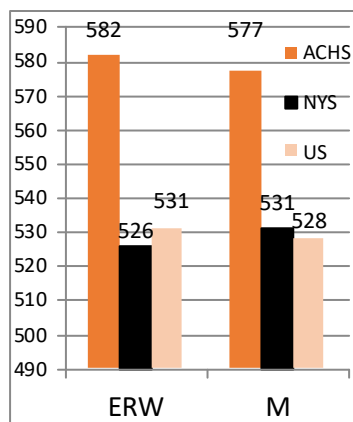

2022 Academic Profile

Our School – ACHS is a comprehensive high school of 800+ students located in the historic suburbs of Buffalo, NY – Eggertsville and Snyder. Tradition, Pride and Achievement are the guiding principles of our work at the high school. Amherst has a proud tradition of excellence in academics, arts, and athletics dating back to 1933. Today, Amherst Central High School consistently ranks in the top tier of high schools across Western New York and has enjoyed annual national recognition by US News and World Report and Newsweek for our students' academic success. Our excellent graduation rates pave the way for our graduates to attend competitive colleges and universities and also provide outstanding employment options for those seeking a school to work transition. Our school prides itself on providing a very balanced curriculum with strong emphasis on academic rigor, artistic training, personal wellness and character development. Students are well rounded, fulfilling requirements beyond that of New York State in computer technology, practical arts as well as career and financial management.

Our community - Amherst Central High School is situated in Snyder, a hamlet of the town of Amherst, NY. The hamlet hosts two structures listed on the National Register of Historic Places that serve as architectural artifacts of the early residential developments in the hamlet.

For decades, being situated between the University of Buffalo South and North Campus, Amherst has been a diverse community with an international flavor and strong values rooted in learning. Our mission is educating the whole child, and we strive to create successful global citizens armed for a lifetime of professional success and personal integrity.

Statistics Class of 2022

- 83% of seniors went on to further their education (74% to 4-year colleges/universities; 9% to 2-year schools)

Amherst Academies of Marketing, Hospitality, Accounting, and Computer Information Systems, are available to students.
